Resolutions & LOPPW's Advocacy

The East Central Synod of Wisconsin and Greater Milwaukee Synod passed resolutions to address the significant problem of money in politics, in particular, related to the 2010 Citizens United ruling, which

has enabled an unrestricted amount of money to influence politics. LOPPW's policy council will look at ways to support both synods' efforts to decrease the influence of money in politics, which was one of our former priorities, on a state level. In addition, we will be in dialogue with our D.C. office about federal efforts.

Background of <u>Citizens United</u>: In 2010, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in *Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission* to reverse "century-old campaign finance restrictions and enabled corporations and other outside groups to spend unlimited funds on elections. While wealthy donors, corporations, and special interest groups have long had an outsized influence in elections, that sway has dramatically expanded since the *Citizens United* decision, with negative repercussions for American democracy and the fight against political corruption." – Brennan Center for Justice
